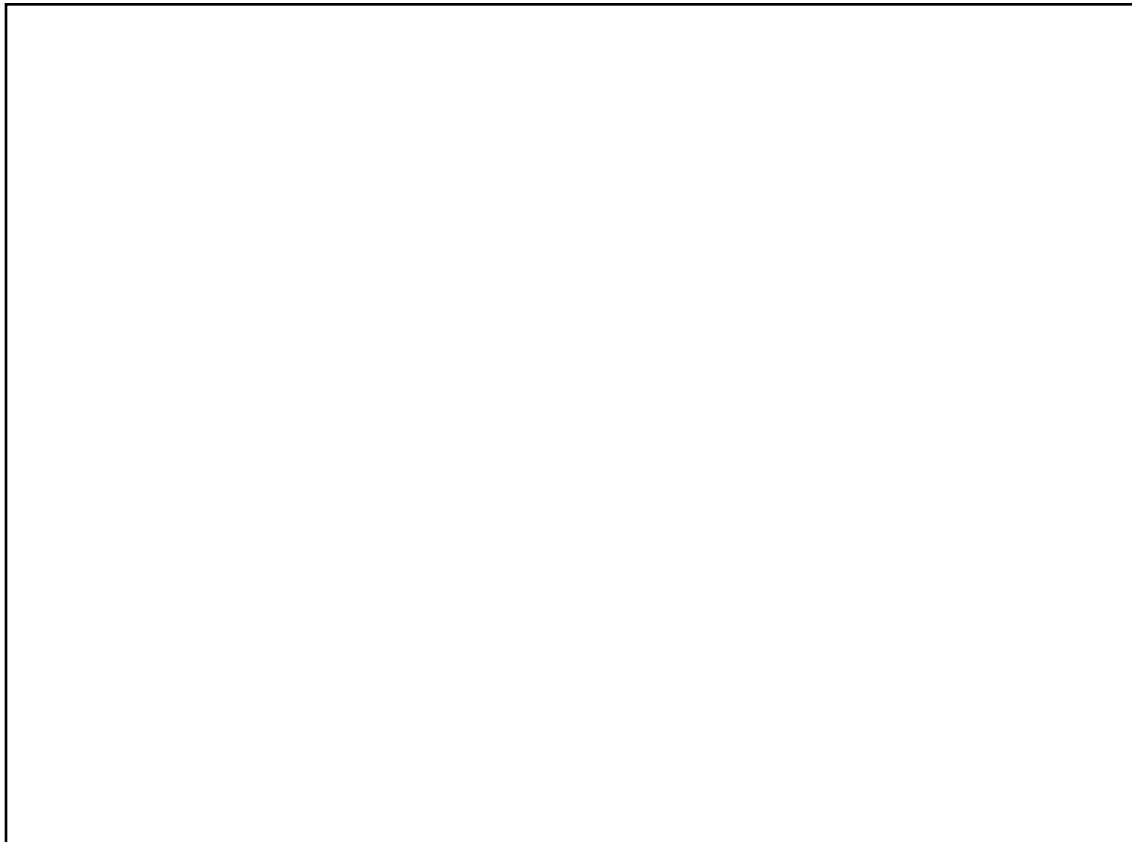

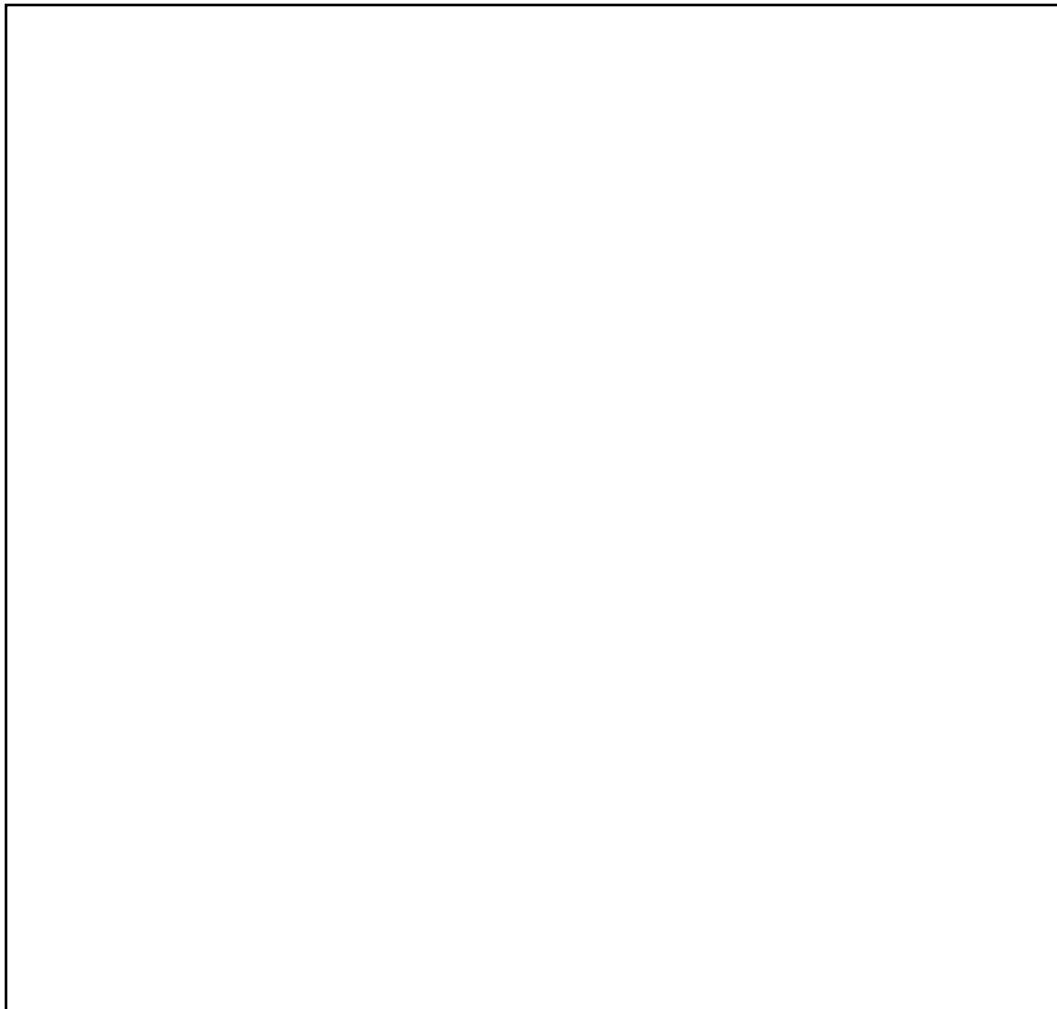

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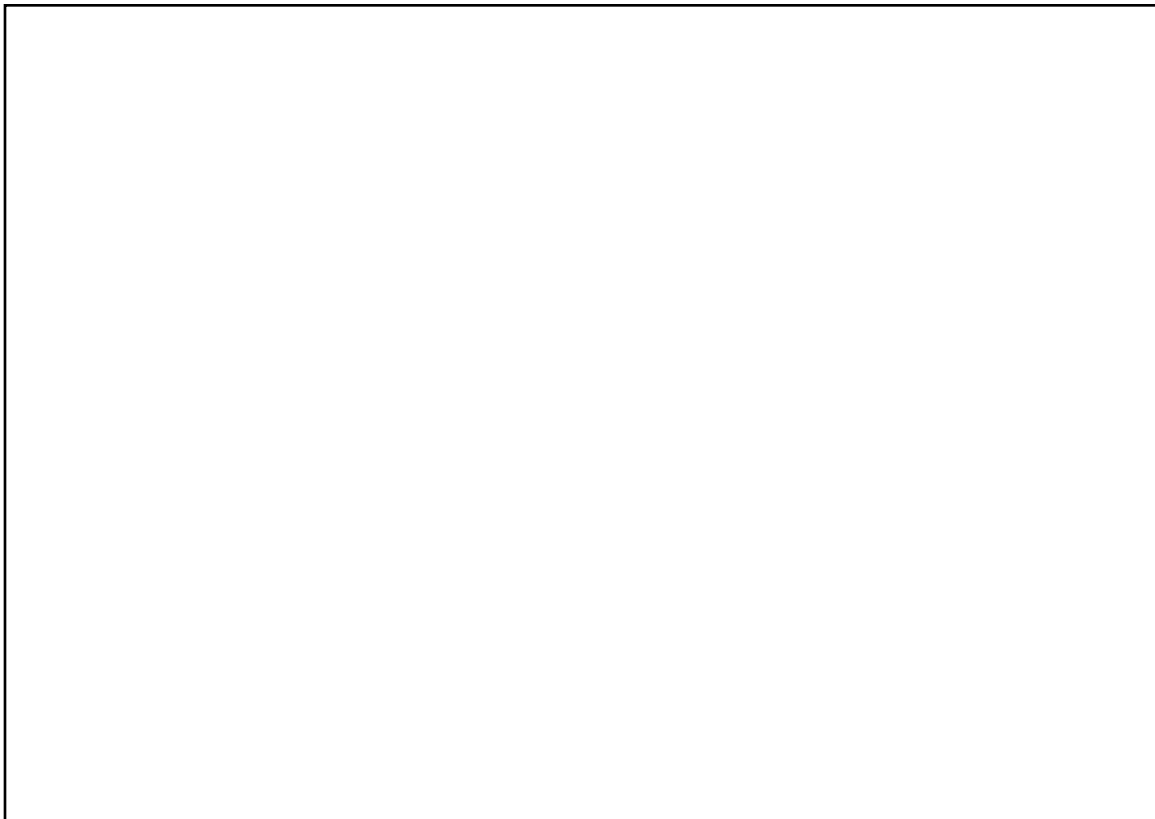

PLANTS. Plants were an early form of life that appeared on earth millions of years ago.
